

City of Ione Fire Department

Burn permits are available at City Hall Monday through Thursday from 8:30 a.m.- 4:30 p.m. and Friday from 08:30-12:00.

A VALID BURN PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO BURN WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF IONE.

Open Burning requirements:

It must be a permissive burn day call 209-223-6246

Article 1 Burning must be done in an area that is not less than 50 ft. from any structure and provision made to prevent fire from spreading to within 50ft. of any structure.

Article 2 Person doing the burning must be present at all times a hose sufficient in length and connected to a regular hose bib with water available shall be present at all times during burning **Article 3** Burning shall not be done on windy days

Article 5 Burning will not be done in a manner which will cause discomfort to your neighbors Article 6 It is to be understood that should a complaint be lodged against you for burning, the office of the Fire Chief will review the complaint and your burning permit may be suspended Article 7 It is also understood that you will be held liable for any damage which may be caused as a result of fire which you have ignited

Article 8 Failure to comply with the burning regulations set forth in Article 1 through 5 is a misdemeanor and subject to a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars **Article 9** No pile shall exceed 4 ft x 4 ft in size

NO BURN BARRELS ARE ALLOWED.

You may burn the following dry materials: Plants, tree trimmings, leaves and lawn clippings only if the following requirements are met:

- A. It must be a valid burn day 223-6246
- B. All the materials come from the yard of a one family or 2 family dwelling
- C. The material is burned on the property of the dwelling where the material originated
- D. The material to be burned shall be dry, loosely packed and reasonably free of dirt and soil in order to burn with a minimum amount of smoke. Ignite only the amount of material that can be reasonably expected to be eliminated or reduced during regular burning hours.

REMEMBER THE SMOKE YOU CAUSE MAY AFFECT YOUR NEIGHBORS. YOU SHOULD ONLY BURN WHEN THESE CONDITIONS CAN BE MINIMIZED AND THE WIND DOES NOT BLOW DIRECTLY INTO THEIR HOME.
